BAYADA Clients Find Acceptance and Inclusion Through Team IMPACT



Identical twins Brennan and Brody, 14, were all smiles at a Signing Day press conference when they became honorary members of the Providence College men's basketball team, the Friars.

The coaches and players were excited to welcome their new team members, all thanks to their partnership with Team IMPACT. A

national, non-profit organization, Team IMPACT matches children facing serious illness and disability with college athletic teams across the country. The relationships that develop between participating children and their college teammates focus on socialization, empowerment, and resilience. For Brennan and Brody, it was a perfect fit.

Brennan and Brody were all smiles as they signed on to become honorary members of the Providence Friars Basketball team.

According to their mom Alli, the boys were born with a rare genetic condition that causes epileptic seizures, limited mobility, extreme fatigue, and developmental delays, impacting temperature and blood pressure regulation. The brothers receive nutrition through a g-tube (feeding tube) and use a wheelchair and walker because they tire very quickly. They have been receiving nursing care from BAYADA for nine years.

"Developmentally, the boys are at a kindergarten level, and it can be hard to understand their speech," said Alli.


"It's hard for them to be on an inclusive sports team with kids their own age. That's why we were so thrilled to learn about Team IMPACT."

What a difference a team makes

As members of the Friars basketball team, the boys get to attend games, tour the locker room, and interact with the players. "They have a short attention span, but they sat through the entire basketball game because they were so excited!" said Alli. "For kids who really want friends and want to be included, it's so cool for them to join the team huddle and fist bump with the players."

Alli is grateful her sons are doing so well and credits their nurses with keeping them safe at home. "They each have their own nurse during the day, each go to school with a nurse, and they share a nurse during the overnight hours," she said. "They have thrived because of the fantastic team who takes phenomenal care of them."

BAYADA Client Welcomes State Senator to Her Home



Salana is a happy seven-year-old living with cerebral palsy, and she relies on care provided through North Carolina's Private Duty Nursing (PDN) program. Without it, Salana would have spent much of her life in an institution, separated from her mother, **Shatara**. Thanks to the PDN program, Shatara can remain a part of the workforce and Salana can live safely in the comfort of home.

Shatara is not only passionate about ensuring her daughter gets the nursing services she needs, but her passion for caring has also translated into a career—providing care to seniors and disabled adults as a BAYADA Home Health Aide.

The family recently hosted a legislative home visit with NC Senator Natalie Murdock to share their story and the challenges they face in accessing the care that keeps them together.

"I'm grateful for Medicaid Private Duty Nursing care," said Shatara, "Before Salana had one-on-one nursing, she was in and out of the hospital. Now I can go to work as a home health aide confident in knowing that my daughter is in good hands."

Shatara shared with Senator Murdock the ripple effect that occurs when providers struggle to recruit a nurse due to inadequate Medicaid reimbursement rates. Not only is Salana's health at risk, but Shatara is also forced to call out of work, which in turns impacts another family who relies on home care.

Salana's nurse **Jessica Britton** also joined the legislative home visit. "I've been with BAYADA for 11 years and I love what I do. Home care is a more intimate setting because you get to work one-on-one, building a bond, shared Jessica. "I'm advocating for increased funding because I could work elsewhere for more, but I don't want to break my bond with my client."

Senator Murdock appreciated the opportunity to see first-hand just how significant home care is in the lives of clients like Salana, and she understood the urgency of ensuring programs like PDN are adequately funded. "As lawmakers, it is our responsibility to fund fiscally responsible programs while ensuring families get the support they need," she said. "Medicaid in-home care fits that bill!"
