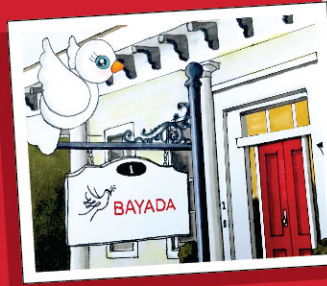


Dovey Learns About BAYADA
