

COVID-19 Vaccination Info by State



We encourage all BAYADA staff to **take advantage of any opportunity to safely get vaccinated** from any state Department of Health, hospital, or pharmacy (CVS, Rite Aid, or Walgreens) before vaccinations are available through our Aetna/CVS partnership.

Vaccine Field Lieutenants are directly sharing these opportunities in real-time with directors, with the expectation that directors will cascade the information immediately to all eligible employees based on vaccination phase. As additional opportunities through pop-up clinics are known, they are being vetted through the COVID Command Center and will be shared as soon as possible. As you can imagine, the vaccination appointments fill up quickly and opportunities are very fluid and rapidly changing. **If you can get a spot, get your shot!**

Phase 1A: In progress

- Eligible healthcare workers

Phase 1B: Begins January 11, 2021

- K-12 school staff and childcare workers
- Law Enforcement/Protective Services*
- Adults age 75 and older

People in Phase 1B must have an appointment to get vaccinated. No walk-ins will be allowed.

Eligibility:

Phase 1A: In progress

- High-risk healthcare workers
- Long-term care facility staff and residents

Phase 1B:

- Health care workers with less direct contact with COVID-19 patients (e.g., home health, hospice, pharmacy, dental, etc.) and EMS
- Firefighters, police, COVID-19 response personnel, correctional workers, and funeral services
- People age 70 and older.

- Frontline essential workers in education, food and agriculture, manufacturing, U.S. postal service, public transit and specialized transportation staff, grocery, public health, frontline essential human service workers, and direct care providers for Coloradans experiencing homelessness
- Essential officials from executive, legislative and judicial branches of state government
- Essential frontline journalists

- Persons aged 16-64 with medical conditions that increase the risk for severe COVID-19

Phase 1A

- Other staff in a healthcare facility who have direct contact with patients
- Long-term Care Facility Residents and workers
- Public-facing first responders

Phase 1B

- Age 80 and older – Eligible beginning 1/6
- Age 70-79 – Eligibility date to be determined
- Age 60-69 – Eligibility date to be determined

Eligibility:

Phase 1A:

- Started December 11, 2020 for paid and unpaid persons confirmed through the NJ Department of Health that all Home Care, Home Health, Hospice, and Senior Living, clinical and non-clinical
- All BAYADA field, office, and support staff are eligible

Phase 1B: Starting Jan 7

- Frontline essential workers and individuals over 75
- Sworn law enforcement personnel; fire professionals; first responders.

Mega Sites:

In mid-January, six “mega sites” will open throughout NJ that will serve as vaccination hubs for phased priority groups:

Phase 1A:

- High-risk hospital workers
- Residents and staff at nursing homes and other congregate care facilities

- All Outpatient/Ambulatory front-line, high-risk health care workers of any age who provide direct in-person patient care
- All staff who are in direct contact with patients (i.e., intake staff)
- Home care workers
- Residents and staff at nursing homes and other congregate care facilities
- Hospice workers

Phase 1B: Initial groups Beginning January 11, 2021 Eligible New Yorkers in Phase 1b:

- Teachers and education workers
- First responders
- Public safety workers
- Public transit workers
- People 75 and older

Prior to receiving the vaccination, you must complete the New York State COVID-19 Vaccine Form. This form can be completed online and you will receive a submission ID, or you can fill out the form at your vaccination site. Individuals being vaccinated must bring proof of eligibility to the vaccination site. This may include an employee ID card, a letter from an employer or affiliated organization, or a pay stub, depending on the specific priority status.

Eligibility:

A free COVID-19 vaccine will be available to all who want it, but supplies will be limited at first. To save lives and slow the spread of COVID-19, independent state and federal health advisory committees recommended first protecting health care workers caring for patients with COVID-19, people who are at the highest risk of being hospitalized or dying, and those at high risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Phase 1a:

- Health care workers caring for COVID-19 patients & Long-Term Care staff and residents

Phase 1b:

- Adults 75 years or older and frontline essential workers

Phase 2:

- Adults at high risk for exposure and at increased risk of severe illness

Phase 3:

- Students

Phase 4:

- Everyone who wants a safe and effective COVID-19 vaccination

South Carolina is vaccinating those in Phase 1a of the state's vaccine plan as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the South Carolina COVID-19 Vaccine Advisory Committee (VAC), which is comprised of representatives from many groups of people in our communities. The overarching goal of Phase 1a is preventing deaths. Front-line medical workers and long-term care facility residents and staff are among those prioritized for Phase 1a vaccine distribution.

As additional vaccines are approved and vaccine supplies increase, COVID-19 vaccine will be available for everyone. COVID-19 vaccine supply is expected to increase substantially in 2021.

Eligibility:

In Phase 1A, **health care workers** and long-term care residents and staff are being notified directly about when and where they can get vaccinated.

The Health Department is not keeping a list of eligible people. When there is enough vaccine available, we will announce how and when Vermonters can register for appointments and who is eligible. In addition to Health Department communications, we will work with partners such as health care practices, pharmacies, employers, and local news media to announce additional groups who become eligible for the vaccine.
